Montana On the Road to Play WSU Wildcats, Saturday, Nov. 3

THE GAME: The University of Montana Grizzlies (4-5/2-4 BSC) play the Weber State Wildcats (1-7/1-4 BSC) in a *Big Sky Conference* game in WSU's Stewart Stadium (17,500) on a game which will be televised on **ROOT Sports**, Saturday, Nov. 3, with kickoff at 1:38 p.m. (Mtn.).

GRIZ RADIO: Veteran **Mick Holien**, who has been chosen "*Montana Sportscaster of the Year*" an unprecedented 12 times in his career, is now in his 20th season as the "Voice" of Grizzly football. Former Griz (1991-94) wide receiver **Scott Gurnsey** and **Greg Sundberg** provide color commentary. UM's flagship station is KGVO Radio, 1290 AM/KVWE 101.5 FM. (*The entire 2012 Grizzly Football Radio Network is listed on add 6-6-6 of the weekly release.*)

TV: The Grizzly-Wildcat game will be televised by **ROOT SPORTS**. For **DIRECTV** customers it is available on ROOT SPORTS Channel 687 in the Northwest region and Channel 683 in the Rocky Mountain Region. The game will be available on **Audience Network Channel 239-1**. For **Dish Network** customers it airs on Channel 426 in the Northwest Region and Channel 414 in the Rocky Mountain Region.

ROOT SPORTS ANNOUNCERS -- UM at WSU: **Tom Glasgow** (play-by-play), **Sherdric Bonner** (analyst), and **Jenny Cavnar** (sideline reporter).

STREAMING: The Grizzly-Wildcat contest will **NOT** be video streamed.

MONTANA-WSU SERIES HISTORY: Montana leads the series 38-13. The Grizzlies have won 17 of the last 20 games. The Wildcats have been victorious the last two times in Ogden, winning 30-21 in 2010 and 45-28 in 2008, although UM is 17-7 all-time there. (*WSU quick facts and Grizzly-Wildcat series game-by game scores on add 3-3-3 of the weekly release.*)

GRIZ LAST WEEK: At Montana 70, Idaho State 24: The Griz displayed a potent running game and scored on six of their first eight possessions and carried that momentum on their way to a convincing victory. Montana rushed 61 times for 379 yards and 6 touchdowns, and racked up 605 total yards and narrowly missed a school record by picking up 33 (the record of 34 was set in UM's 2012 opener against South Dakota) first downs.

GRIZ OFFENSIVE LEADERS VERSUS ISU: Halfback **Peter Nguyen** had 11 carries for 107 yards and a touchdown, while **Jordan Canada** had 16 rushes for 83 yards and a score. **Joey Counts** had 6 carries for 58 yards, while **Brett Kirschner** had 13 totes for 54 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Quarterback **Shay Smithwick-Hann** was 14-of-21-2 for 205 yards and 3 touchdowns in his first career start. **Counts**, a true freshman., caught a team-high 4 passes for 36 yards and scored twice. Nine different Griz players had at least one reception and one rush in the game.

UM DEFENSIVE LEADERS VS. ISU: End **Tyrone Holmes**, a true freshman, had 9 tackles and tied the school record with 4 sacks. Junior linebacker **Jordan Tripp** had 6 tackles, 2.5 stops for losses, and a forced the fumble that led to his 80-yard touchdown run on a fumble return.

NGUYEN MOVES UP ON CAREER LIST: **Nguyen** now has 1,770 career rushing yards, which moved him up to ninth on the career list.

MONTANA'S WEEKLY POW NOMINEES: **Nguyen**, from Seattle, Wash., was UM's nominee, while **Holmes**, from Eagle Point, Ore., was nominated from the defense. The Griz did not have a special teams nominee.

GRIZ TRAVEL PLANS: The team will travel to Ogden via Beach Bus. Lodging is at the Ogden Marriott (801-627-1190). The team walk-thru on Friday, Nov. 2, is at 2:30 p.m. and it is **CLOSED**. The team will return to Missoula ASAP after the game on Saturday night.

11-of-14-Was Montana in third down conversions (78.6%) against ISU last Saturday.

12th-In the nation are the Griz ranked in total offense at 464.56 yards a game, which leads the Big Sky Conference.

12th-In the nation is Montana also ranked in tackles for loss at 7.44 a game (67 for -283).

17-of-20-Times have the Grizzlies defeated the Wildcats, going back to the 1993 season.

83-52-Montana is getting out-scored in the fourth quarter. The Griz have scored three points in the fourth quarter in their last two games, and have been out-scored 19-3 in those two contests.

119th-In the nation out of 122 FCS teams are the Griz ranked in pass defense, giving up 309.89 yards per game through the air.

THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA'S MICK DELANEY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH: First Year at Montana (4-5)

Mick Delaney was named the 35th head football coach at The University of Montana in July of 2012, and he signed a two-year contract.

Delaney was an assistant coach at Montana from 2008-11, working with the running backs and he was also the associate head coach. He had retired briefly before returning to UM and assuming the position as UM's head coach.

He was instrumental in the development of running back Chase Reynolds, who rushed for 4,067 yards and a school-record 52 touchdowns the previous three seasons.

A veteran mentor, Mick began coaching football in 1964. This will be his 28th season of coaching football at the collegiate level.

Originally from Butte, he came to Montana from Colorado State where he was an assistant coach for former head coach Sonny Lubick for 15 seasons from 1993-2007.

Former Griz head coach Bobby Hauck hired Delaney in 2008. Pflugrad retained Delaney as the lone official holdover from Hauck's staff.

While at CSU, Delaney coached some of the finest running backs in school history, including five first-team all-conference selections such as Cecil Sapp (2000). Sapp was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award and set a school rushing record with 1,601 yards in 2002. Sapp went on to play with the Denver Broncos.

Prior to coaching the Rams, Delaney was the head football coach and athletic director at Western Montana, Dillon, in 1991 and 92. He served as the athletic director at Montana Tech in Butte from 1983-85.

Delaney began his coaching career at Butte Central High School (1964-67) as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach. He also taught English at Central.

Delaney was an assistant football coach under former UM head coach Jack Swarhout from 1968-69. He was UM's head wrestling coach at that time as well. He then moved on to Great Falls High School (1969-76) where he taught English and was the assistant wrestling and track and field coach. He coached on Lubick's staff at Montana State from 1979-80.

He earned his B.A. in education at UM-Western (Western Montana College) in 1964. He is an inaugural inductee into the Western Montana College Sports Hall of Fame and was honored by the Montana Coaches Association in 1972 as the Wrestling Coach of the Year. In 1974 he was named the Football Coach of the Year by that organization. He also belonged to many associations during his athletic career including the Montana Coaches Association from 1968-1985.

Mick and his wife Cheri have three children, son Mike, daughters Shauna Basile and Melissa Ossello, and nine grandchildren.

QUOTING GRIZ HEAD COACH MICK DELANEY

ON ISU WIN: “It was probably needed as much as anything. It was like the old saying, ‘it’s just what the doctor ordered. Obviously Idaho State has struggled during the year, but when we sat back and watched the tapes (of the game) yesterday, we did a lot of good things. We had 12 possessions through the game and we scored on nine of them. That’s a heck of a day no matter who you are playing, when you have the high of a percentage of touchdowns per possession on the offensive side of the football. We ran the ball well which we thought we could do, and had to do. Shay was very affective. He really manages the offense well. In fact, when Trent (McKinney) went in he did a nice job.

“Defensively, basically they had a little over 200 yards of total offense until we had the three and fours in there. That might be the only opportunity that some of those guys will ever get on the field for the Griz. About every kid that was available played. That’s a little bit of a reward for coming to practice every single day from August 7 until last Friday. I thought that in special teams we were solid. (Senior wide receiver) Gerald Kemp added a real spark to us on special teams with a couple of tackles and two or three since returns, and he had a catch or two on offense. So, overall special teams, defense and offense had good day. Overall I am just extremely happy for the kids. I think they needed a day like that.”

ON GAME AT WSU: “We’ve struggled in Ogden since I’ve been here, and this is my fifth season here at U of M. The two previous times we have gone there we have lost. They’ll be good at home.

“When you look at their schedule they did lose some games early, but two of those were early to FBS teams (37-10 at Fresno State and 45-13 at BYU), and then they had three losses to three teams that were ranked in the FCS (35-21 to #19 McNeese State; 32-26 to #9 Eastern Washington; and 45-23 to #20 Cal Poly). After that they played a good Sacramento State team down to the wire (a 19-14 home win by the Hornets), and then just came back and beat what we still think is a good Southern Utah team on the road (24-22 on Oct.19).

“They play well at home. Their quarterback (Mike) Hoke is an excellent athlete. He’s a big, strong guy who runs the ball well and is one of their leading rushers (179 yards and 2 touchdowns), and he also throws the ball very, very adequately (147-of-255-8 for 1,511 yards and 8 TDs). They’re big and strong up front on offense like Weber State always is, and they have a dangerous running back in (C.J.) Tuckett (514 yards rushing for 5 TDs).

“They have good experience back on defense with seven or eight starters back, and have a good leader at middle linebacker (junior Anthony Morales) who has a bunch of tackles for them.

“We will have our hands completely full, and we will be a little short-handed. It will be a real challenge for us to go there and play to the best of our ability. That will be our challenge to our players this week. We just have to make sure, that we, as coaches, put a plan together to give us an opportunity to win the game.”

Grizzlies' two senior running backs rushed for more than 100 yards each, as the 10th/11th-ranked host Grizzlies defeated the University of South Dakota Coyotes 35-24 in the season opener for the teams Saturday afternoon in front of 25,156 partisan fans in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

Dan Moore had career-highs of 27 carries for 148 yards and a touchdown, while fellow UM senior halfback Peter Nguyen had 10 totes for 192 yards and a score. The Grizzlies picked up a school-record 34 first downs in the win.

UM (1-0) dominated USD in total yards (568 to 233) and first downs (34 to 9), but found itself in an eight point (24-16) deficit mid-way through the third quarter.

Montana led 16-10 at halftime, but the Coyotes, coached by former (2000-02) Griz mentor Joe Glenn, scored back-to-back touchdowns in a little more than a minute to take a 24-16 lead at the 9:47 mark of the third stanza.

On its first play of the third period quarterback Josh Vander Maten hit fellow sophomore Terrance Terry for an 80-yard downtown bomb, giving USD a 17-16 edge. Just a few plays later safety Charlie Goro picked off a Trent McKinney pass and returned it 50 yards for another score to give the visitors the 24-16 advantage.

The Grizzlies quickly regained the momentum, though with a bit of trickery, as on their next series senior tight end Greg Hardy connected with senior wide receiver Bryce Carver for a 39-yard touchdown, and UM cut the USD lead to 24-22 with 7:11 left in the third.

Two series after Hardy's first career pass attempt and subsequent TD, the Grizzlies scored back-to-back touchdowns thanks to two straight USD turnovers.

The first USD mistake came when UM linebacker John Kanongata'a picked off a Vander Maten pass and the Griz took possession of the ball on the Coyotes' 34-yard line. Two runs by Nguyen picked up 20 yards, and then Moore broke free for a 14-yard scoring jaunt, and Montana led 28-24 with 4:49 remaining in the third stanza and would lead the rest of the way.

The Griz added an insurance score when sophomore defensive end Tonga Takai recovered a Coyote fumble on the USD 13-yard line. Three plays later Nguyen scored on a 3-yard run with 3:25 left in the third, in what proved to be the final points of the game.

Montana took an early 10-0 lead on a 21-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider and a 4-yard scoring pass from McKinney to senior wide receiver Sam Gratton. USD then cut the UM lead to 10-3 on a field goal by Kevin Robb with 10:33 left in the second quarter.

The Griz took a 16-3 lead on an 18-yard scoring strike from McKinney to junior wide receiver Cam Warren (his first career TD) with 6:08 left until intermission. An 8-yard Vander Maten to Terry pass made it 16-10 Grizzlies at the break.

The USD pick for a touchdown was one of the few mistakes that McKinney, a redshirt freshman in his first start, would make in the contest. The 6-0, 205-pounder from Mililani, Hawaii, was 26-of-32-1 (81.3%) for 214 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and he also rushed 13 times for 65 yards.

Gratton and sophomore wide-out Sean Haynes had a game-high 5 receptions each, while Carver and Nguyen had 4 grabs each. Warren had 3 grabs for 41 yards and a score.

The Griz racked up 315 yards rushing on 64 carries; ran 98 plays; had a 11-minute (35:57 to 23:03) edge in time of possession, to go along with their single-game record of 34 total first downs.

Junior linebacker Jordan Tripp led the Griz with 10 tackles, and also had a sack and a forced fumble. Kanongata'a added 8 stops, while senior linebacker Josh Stuber added 6 tackles. The Grizzly defense held USD to 233 total yards (61 rushing) and 9 first downs.

BOONE, N.C. (9/8/12) – It was everything it was expected to be, but if you are a member of Griz Nation it did not come out the way you wanted it to.

It was a match-up between two of the powerhouse programs in the FCS, and it came down to the final minutes, but the host team scored two fourth-quarter TDs in the victory.

Quarterback Jamal Jackson threw two touchdown passes and running back Steven Miller rushed for two scores as the 8th/11th-ranked Appalachian State Mountaineers held off the never-say-die 9th/12th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies for a 35-27 victory in front of 30,856 mostly partisan fans in ASU's Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Montana had its biggest play of the young season with 8:54 left to play, as senior running back Dan Moore caught a screen pass from redshirt freshman Trent McKinney, and Moore broke free for an 87-yard touchdown – tying the school record for the fifth longest scoring reception, and cutting the ASU lead to 28-27. Unfortunately, redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider missed the ensuing PAT, and the Mountaineers led by one point.

ASU tacked on a security TD with 5:05 remaining on a 2-yard touchdown run by Miller.

Despite four turnovers, the Griz had a chance to tie the game on their last series. They advanced the ball to the ASU 42-yard line, but with 18 seconds left McKinney was picked off and the Mountaineers secured the win.

ASU had regained the lead with 13:03 left in the game, Jackson hit junior wide-out Andrew Peacock for a 25-yard touchdown, and ASU took a 28-21 lead.

The third quarter wasn't anything like the first two, as the defenses played very well, and neither team scored in that stanza.

The Griz tied the game for the second time in the opening half, when McKinney hooked up with senior wide receiver Sam Gratton for a 7-yard TD pass, making the score 21-all with 35 seconds remaining until intermission. It was an impressive first half for UM, as they gained 306 total yards, while ASU had 179.

ASU took the lead on its second possession of the game, a 9-play, 60-yard drive, capped off by a 13-yard scoring run by senior halfback Steven Miller, giving the home team a 14-7 lead at the 3:23 mark of the first stanza.

The Mountaineers took advantage of Montana's second turnover of the first quarter, as Jackson scored on a 5-yard run to give ASU a 21-7 cushion. ASU started that drive on the Griz 27-yard line after true freshman Chase Naccarato fumbled on a kickoff return.

The Griz cut the ASU lead to 21-14 on 9-play, 75-yard scoring drive with 13:12 left until half, as McKinney scored his first career rushing touchdown on a 10-yard run.

Both teams scored on their first possessions of the game. The Grizzlies took a 7-0 lead on a 2-yard touchdown pass from McKinney to fellow redshirt freshman Gavin Hagfors, who scored on his first career catch.

The Mountaineers came right back, though, as Jackson connected with wide receiver Shawn Rice on a 32-yard scoring pass, knotting the score at 7-7 with 9:18 to go in the opening quarter.

McKinney was 15-of-29 for a career-high 307 yards and 3 TDs, but he was picked off three times. Gratton had 3 receptions for 104, and one score – all in the first half. Moore rushed 15 times for 93 yards and had 3 catches for a career-high 145 yards. McKinney gained 68 yards on 13 totes.

The Griz defense was led by sophomore free safety Matt Hermanson with 12 tackles, while junior linebacker John Kanongata added 10 stops.

Jackson was 24-of-34-0 for 260 yards and 2 TDs. Miller rushed 27 times for 91 yards.

MISSOULA, MONTANA – Under a hazy, smoke-filled sky due to near-by forest fires, the 14th-ranked Grizzlies defeated the visiting Liberty University Flames in UM's final non-league game of the season in Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

They say the numbers don't lie, but they did this time. In the first meeting of these two teams, Liberty had more first downs, more passing yards and more time with the ball. While the Flames may have seemed more dominant offensively, Montana used their time efficiently to rack up 201 rushing yards, almost 10 times that of what Liberty (0-3) put on the board. And, it paid off by giving the Grizzlies (2-1) their second victory of the season.

Montana built up some much-needed momentum when senior halfback Peter Nguyen returned a 90-yard punt for a touchdown with 5:54 left in the first quarter. Nguyen's return ranks as the third longest punt return in school history.

To open up the second quarter, Montana's defense forced a fumble to give the Grizzlies possession of the ball at Liberty's 32-yard line. On the next play, Dan Moore pummeled through Liberty's defense for a touchdown. Montana lengthened its lead 14-0. With a little less than ten minutes left to go in the quarter, redshirt freshman quarterback Trent McKinney rushed six yards into the end zone to up the Grizzly lead to 21-0.

Redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider was looking to improve his consistency, and he did just that. To close out the second quarter, Lider kicked a 42-yard field goal to put the Griz up 24-0. Lider also connected two PAT tries after the three UM touchdowns.

Liberty tried to stage a comeback with a 14-yard touchdown pass from redshirt freshman quarterback Josh Woodrum to senior wide receiver Pat Kelly to put the Flames on the board in the third quarter, while their defense held Montana to no touchdowns in that stanza.

To start off the fourth quarter, Montana answered back with a touchdown of its own. McKinney connected a two yard pass with senior tight end Greg Hardy to put one in the end zone. The Grizzlies distanced themselves from the Flames 31-7.

Less than two minutes later, the Flames created some momentum of their own on a five-play, 92-yard scoring drive that culminated with a 31-yard pass from Woodrum to senior wide receiver Ryan Ferguson. The Grizzly defense held strong and handed the game off to the offense with 5:34 left to go in the game. They put Lider in position to connect on a 46 yard field goal – a career long.

The Grizzlies ended the game with a bang when redshirt freshman linebacker Nick Holt forced a Liberty fumble which was recovered by redshirt freshman safety Justin Whitted. Montana rolled down the clock and closed out the game at Liberty's 17-yard line.

McKinney completed 19 of 26 passes for 95 yards and rushed for 28 yards on seven totes. He had no interceptions and was sacked once. Hardy had seven receptions for 29 yards and one touchdown. Moore racked up 92 yards with 16 carries. The Grizzlies, who had four turnovers last Saturday at Appalachian State, turned the ball over just once on a fumble.

Montana's defense was led by junior linebacker John Kanongata'a, who had 10 tackles, while redshirt sophomore defensive end Zack Wagenmann had three stops for loss, a pair of sacks, and a pass deflection.

Woodrum was 34-of-440-1 for 322 yards and two touchdowns, while Kelly had 14 receptions for 88 yards and a TD.

Next Saturday Montana celebrates homecoming, and opens up Big Sky Conference play against the Northern Arizona Lumberjacks. Liberty hosts Lehigh.

NAU 41, At Montana 31

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The Northern Arizona Lumberjacks snapped a 14-game winning skein by The University of Montana Grizzlies and they also ended UM's 19-game Homecoming winning streak on a warm, smoky day in Washington-Grizzly Stadium

It was also the first win ever for NAU mentor Jerome Souers, a former (1986-97) longtime assistant coach at UM, who is in his 14th season as the head man in Flagstaff.

Junior halfback Zach Bauman rushed for a career-high 253 yards along with 3 touchdowns to lead the Jacks, and the NAU defense forced five Griz turnovers.

It was a game of two completely halves for the Griz. Montana rallied from an early 7-0 deficit and scored 24 unanswered points, and the Grizzlies took a 24-7 lead with 13:16 remaining in the second quarter on a 12-yard touchdown run by senior halfback/fullback Dan Moore.

But after Moore's scoring run gave UM a 17-point advantage, NAU racked up six consecutive unanswered scores, and took a 41-24 lead on Bauman's third scoring run of the afternoon, this on a 2-yarder with just 5:53 left in the contest.

The Griz finally got on the board after more than a 40-minute scoring drought, as sophomore quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann hit redshirt freshman wide receiver Ellis Henderson on a 45-yard touchdown pass with 1:58 left to go.

Bauman showed a sign of things to come on a NAU's first play from scrimmage, as he broke loose for an 11-second, 75-yard scoring run, giving the Jacks an early 7-0 lead.

But, the Griz bounced right back, as redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider hit a 27-yard field goal, and then Moore regained the lead for his team on a 6-yard scoring run (which was set up thanks to a blocked punt by junior tight end Clay Pierson), making it 10-7 UM with 9:49 left in the first quarter. Moore's scoring burst was followed by a 31-yard TD jaunt by redshirt freshman Trent McKinney, and then Moore's 12-yard score, but those 24 points would be all that Montana would muster.

NAU cut the Griz lead to 10 points with 9:15 left in the second quarter on a 3-yard run by senior transfer (Cal) Covaguhn DeBoksie-Johnson, and it ended up 24-14 UM at halftime.

The Jacks took the lead back for good in the third quarter on a touchdown pass from senior quarterback Cary Grossart to sophomore tight end R. J. Rickert, which was followed up by a pair of field goals by junior kicker Andy Wilder, and Wilder's 23-yarder with 1:49 left in the third stanza gave NAU the lead (27-24) for good.

Bauman, who had 29 carries, gave NAU some breathing room, scoring on touchdown runs of 20 and 2 yards in the final quarter, the second scoring run coming with 5:53 left to play in the contest.

McKinney had a solid first half, going 13-of-17-1 for 161 yards and rushing five times for 50 yards. But he struggled in the final two quarters, and finished the game 20-of-34-3 for 199 yards, and had 49 total rushing yards due to two sacks.

Senior wide receiver Sam Gratton had a game-high 5 catches for 72 yards, while Henderson had 3 grabs for 99 yards and a TD.

Grossart, who had missed NAU's previous two games because of a knee injury, was 16-of-23-0 for 138 yards and one touchdown.

CHENEY, WASH. – It was a heartbreaking loss for the Grizzlies, as the Eagles had two late-game scores in the last two-and-a-half minutes to overcome a 26-17 Grizzlies lead.

EWU started off the first quarter with a touchdown with 10:47 left to in the first quarter, as running back Demetrius Bronson rushed for a 5-yard TD to give the Eagles an early 7-0 lead.

UM answered with a touchdown of their own, as senior halfback Peter Nguyen scored on a 37-yard run to tie the game at 7-7 with 4:40 left to go in the first quarter.

EWU regained the lead when Vernon Adams hit wide receiver Brandon Kaufman for a 36-yard scoring pass, making it 14-7 EWU with 11:42 left in the second quarter.

UM cut the margin to 14-10 on a 27-yard field goal by Chris Lider with 7:10 to go until the half. The Eagles' Kevin Miller kicked a 19-yard kick to close out the first half, EWU leading 17-10.

The Grizzlies put together a 15-play, 73-yard drive, with redshirt freshman quarterback Trent McKinney scoring on a 7-yard run. Lider missed the PAT, though, and the Eagles led 17-16.

The Griz recovered a fumble by Miller on the Eagles' 8-yard line, and two plays later sophomore halfback Jordan Canada scored on a 2-yard run and UM led 23-17. Lider tacked on another field goal to give UM a 26-17 lead with 8:26 remaining in the game.

But, Adams completed pass after pass and hit Kaufman on a 30-yard touchdown pass to cut the Grizzlies' lead to 26-24 with 2:19 left to play.

EWU then recovered an onside kick and scored the go-ahead touchdown after wide receiver Ashton Clark caught a 20-yard scoring pass from Adams. EWU then converted a two-point conversion to take a 36-32 lead with just 53 seconds left to play.

The Grizzlies rushed 61 times for 407 yards, and passed for 126, out-gaining the Eagles 533 to 447 in total yards.

Once again, Montana battled turnovers, though, as they fumbled the ball away three times. The Griz lost one fumble on the EWU 12-yard line, another one on the Eagles' 5-yard line, and then finally on an onside kick on the UM 49-yard line, which led to the winning touchdown.

The Griz rushed 61 times for 407 yards, and were led by who gained a career-high 168 yards on 19 carries, while Nguyen added 123 yards on 23 totes. Senior Dan Moore rushed four times for 24 yards, and left the game early with an ankle injury. McKinney rushed for 25 yards and was 14-of-17-0 passing for 126 yards.

Montana's defense was led by linebackers Brock Coyle and Jordan Tripp, with 12 tackles apiece, and Tripp also had three tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

Adams was 25-for-41-1 for 353 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 60 yards to tally 407 yards of total offense. Kaufman had eight receptions for 138 yards and two touchdowns.

GREELEY, COLO. -- The Grizzlies came to life in the second half to snap a two-game losing streak and spoiled the Bears' Homecoming game to get their first Big Sky Conference win of the season.

After suffering two disheartening losses against Northern Arizona (41-31) and Eastern Washington (32-26), Montana desperately needed the victory.

For one of the first times this season, UM was on the opposite side of the turnover battle, as they had none, while the Bears had five. Josh Dennard, Bo Tully, and Nate Harris all intercepted passes by NC quarterback Seth Lobato.

The interception that turned the momentum Montana's way was an interception thrown by UNC punter Mason Puckett. After Puckett had received a bad snap and bobbled the ball he tried a desperation pass that landed in senior special team captain Caleb Walden's hands, who returned it 18 yards for a TD and the Griz had an improbable 7-0 lead with 13:41 to go in the second quarter, and UM would lead for the rest of the game. To end the half, redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider hit a 34-yard field goal as time expired to give Montana a 10-0 advantage at intermission.

The Bears got right back in the game, though, as senior Dominic Gunn returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown to get NC on the board at the 14:46 mark on the third quarter. Gunn had a 94-yard kickoff return for a TD last season against UM.

But, UM's offense came alive in the second half, led by senior halfback Peter Nguyen, along with freshman redshirt quarterback Trent McKinney, who helped the Griz gain 223 yards in the final two quarters of play.

Nguyen rushed for a 13-yard score to give Montana a 17-7 lead at the 11:04 mark of the third quarter.

On NC's next possession, they hit a 24-yard field goal, to keep within one touchdown (17-10) of Montana.

The Griz came right back, as McKinney rushed for a 12-yard TD with 5:42 left in the third quarter, the Grizzlies taking a 24-10 lead.

Montana scored again to start of the fourth quarter, as McKinney connected with junior wide receiver Cam Warren for a 17-yard touchdown. Lider missed the extra point, but Montana led 30-10, with 14:54 left to play.

Junior halfback Tromaine Dennis fumbled the ball on NC's next possession, and the ball was recovered by junior linebacker Brock Coyle at the Bear's 27-yard line, who returned it 23 yards to NC's 4-yard line. Montana had to settle for a 19-yard field goal by Lider with 12:58 left, but led 33-10.

The Grizzlies picked up their final touchdown when sophomore running back Brett Kirschner, who was in the grasp of a NC defender, lateraled the ball to McKinney, who scored from one yard out, giving UM a 30-point (40-10) lead with 6:17 left.

NC managed its only offensive score of the game when Lobato connected with Gunn for a 24-yard TD with 1:32 left.

Nguyen rushed for a career-high of 159 yards on just 15 carries, to average 10.6 yards per attempt. McKinney had 10 carries for 65 yards. As a team, the Grizzlies racked up 294 yards in rushing on 46 carries. McKinney was 14-of-25-0 passing for 142 yards.

Coyle had a career-high 11 tackles, along with a sack and the fumble recovery. Sophomore defensive end Zack Wagenmann had 5 tackles and two sacks. Of the 58 Grizzly players who traveled to Greeley, 57 played.

Lobato was 25-of-42-3 passing for 259 yards and a touchdown. Dennis led the Bears in rushing yards with 14 carries for 50 yards.

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The Southern Utah Thunderbirds handed The University of Montana Grizzlies another disappointing loss, in front of a home crowd of 25,684 Saturday afternoon in Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

SUU outscored Montana 17-3 in the second half to overcome a four-point (17-13) halftime deficit. With the win the T-Birds improved to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in Big Sky Conference play while Montana dipped to 3-4 and 1-3 in league games.

Montana took an early lead when quarterback Trent McKinney hit junior tight end Clay Pierson for a 6-yard touchdown pass, and Chris Liders' PAT gave the Griz a 7-0 lead. SUU pulled within one point (7-6), after recovering a UM fumble on a punt return, as Sorensen hit Fatu Moala for a 7-yard scoring pass. The T-Birds' PAT failed, though, and Montana led a slim, 7-6 with 11 seconds left in the first quarter.

Lider gave the Grizzlies a 10-6 lead with a 43-yard field goal early (13:01) in the second period, but the Thunderbirds took advantage of a short field when UM punter Stephen Shaw shanked a 15-yarder to set SUU up on the UM 43 yard line. SUU scored on the take-way, as Sorensen connected with wide receiver Henna Brown for a 20-yard touchdown, and that gave the T-Birds a 13-10 lead with 6:06 to play in the half.

Montana got the ball back and put together its longest drive of the game, an 11-play, 82-yard effort, that culminated with a 2-yard McKinney TD run by McKinney, and UM regained the lead (17-13) with 2:06 left until intermission, and held onto that slim advantage at the break.

With 5:55 to go in the third quarter, SUU put together a 12-play, 77-yard scoring drive, as Sorensen scored on a quarterback sneak to give his team a 20-17 lead.

Montana was scoreless in the third quarter, but with 7:58 to go in the game, Liders booted a 42-yard field goal to tie up the game at 20-20. The Griz had a couple of scoring opportunities both late in the second quarter and early in the fourth, but were denied both times, as those earlier field kick attempts by Liders from 34 and 38 yards out were blocked by SUU.

On its third possession on the final quarter, SUU put together a scoring drive, and kicker Colton Cook nailed a 38-yard field goal to give the Thunderbirds the lead for good, 23-20, with 2:12 remaining in the game. The big play in the game-winning drive was a 22-yard run by SUU punter Brock Miller on a 4th-and-2 from the UM 49-yard line, which gave the T-Birds a crucial first down and led to the eventual game-winning three-pointer.

Senior running back Peter Nguyen led the Grizzlies with 15 carries for 91 yards. As a team, Montana rushed 42 times for 224 yards. Sophomore running back Jordan Canada had 11 rushes for 71 yards and he also caught 3 passes. McKinney was 17-of-29-1 for 194 yards and one touchdown and rushed for 51 yards and a touchdown.

Junior linebacker Brock Coyle led the Montana defense with 13 tackles, along with 2 forced fumbles and he had one of UM's seven sacks. Junior linebacker Jordan Tripp had 6 tackles and 3 tackles for losses, while sophomore end Zack Wagenmann had 1.5 sacks. Sophomore cornerback Joshua Dennard had 7 tackles and broke up five passes.

Sorensen was 30-of-53-0 passing for 294 yards and 2 touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Fatu Moala had game-highs of 11 catches for 104 yards and a TD. True freshman linebacker Zak Browning led SUU with a game-high 18 tackles.

GRAND FORKS, ND – The Grizzlies had an impressive second-half comeback against Big Sky Conference newcomer North Dakota, and the nail-biter came down to the final seconds at the Alerus Center. In the process, Montana lost its fourth league game in its last five games.

Even though the Grizzly defense held UND scoreless for most of the second half, it outscored Montana 31-17 in the first half, and found some momentum late in the fourth quarter, scoring all of its second-half points in the last two minutes of play.

After a slow start in which it trailed 14-0 in the first quarter, Montana started its comeback after intermission, starting with a 15-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann to senior wide receiver Sam Gratton, which made it 31-24, UND.

The Smithwick-Hann hook-up was followed by a 44-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Chris Lider, and that cut the UND lead to 31-27 with 6:16 left in the third quarter.

Then, with just over six minutes left in the third quarter, the Griz defense got the momentum-changing play it needed, as junior cornerback Sean Murray picked off UND senior quarterback Braden Hanson to give Montana's offense a chance. On the first play after Murray's pick, Smithwick-Hann hooked up with redshirt freshman wide receiver Ellis Henderson for a 27-yard touchdown pass, and Lider's successful PAT gave Montana its first lead of the game -- 34-31 with 6:05 left in the third stanza.

North Dakota tied it (34-34) up with 2:00 remaining in the game when kicker junior kicker Zeb Miller knocked in a 34-yard field goal.

The Grizzlies then went three-and-out on their next series, and gave the ball back to UND with 39 seconds left in the game. That was all the time UND would need, as Hanson then completed four-of-five passes, and the fourth was to unstoppable junior wide receiver Greg Hardin who broke free for a 32-yard touchdown, and UND led 40-34 with just 12 seconds to go.

Montana successfully changed things up on offense early in the game, switching from a run-dominant style to a pass-oriented one when Smithwick-Hann stepped in for starter Trent McKinney in the first quarter.

However, the Griz offense couldn't turn many of its possessions into scoring drives, especially in that first half. But, when Smithwick-Hann connected with senior wide receiver Bryce Carver for a 58-yard touchdown to start off the second quarter, and then Lider later hit a 44-yard field goal, the Griz were still in the contest, although UND led 31-17 at halftime.

Sophomore running back Jordan Canada scored UM's first points on the game on a 21-yard run with 4:05 to go in the first quarter, trimming the UND lead to 14-7.

Smithwick-Hann had career-highs of 26-39-0 passes for 306 yards and three touchdowns. Henderson led Montana's receivers with 112 yards and one touchdown. Canada racked up 91 rushing yards and scored once.

Murray and junior linebacker John Kanongata'a led the Grizzly defense with 11 tackles each, and Kanongata'a also had two sacks. Murray, junior cornerback Anthony Goodwin, and junior safety Bo Tully had one interception apiece.

Hansen was 42-of-61-3 and amassed 660 passing yards – a Big Sky single-game record, while Hardin had 12 receptions for a league-record 333 receiving, and he also grabbed 3 TDs passes.

MISSOULA, MONTANA -- The Grizzlies displayed a potent running game and scored on six of their first eight possessions and carried that momentum on their way to a convincing victory.

The Grizzlies rushed 61 times for 379 yards and 6 touchdowns, and racked up 605 total yards and narrowly missed a school record by picking up 33 (the record of 34 was set in UM's 2012 opener against South Dakota) first downs. The Bengals did get 332 yards passing, but were limited to 35 yards rushing.

The Grizzlies raced to a 21-3 lead in the first quarter, scoring on a 9-yard scoring run by sophomore halfback Jordan Canada, a 17-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback Shay Smithwick-Hann, and a 7-yard TD on a run by sophomore running back Brett Kirschner. ISU's only score on the opening quarter was on a 20-yard field goal by junior kicker Brendon Garcia.

The second quarter was more of the same, as Montana out-scored ISU 21-7 in that stanza. The Griz rolled to a commanding 42-3 lead when they scored three unanswered touchdowns which included a 50-yard scoring run by senior halfback Peter Nguyen, an 80-yard fumble recovery return by junior linebacker Jordan Tripp, and a 4-yard pass from Smithwick-Hann to freshman halfback Joey Counts.

ISU's only touchdown in the first half was a 12-yard pass from senior quarterback Kevin Yost to junior wide-out Luke Austin with 1:53 to go until halftime. The Bengals's TD was set up when Smithwick-Hann was picked off at UM's 15-yard line, and ISU scored three plays later on the Yost-to-Austin hook-up. Montana scored a season-high 42 first-half points, and led 42-10 at intermission.

The Grizzlies scored two unanswered TDs to start the third quarter, on a 5-yard scoring pass from Smithwick-Hann to Counts, and a 1-yard run by Kirschner. Kirschner's scoring run gave Montana a 56-10 lead with 7:22 left in the third quarter.

UM's final scores came on a 3-yard end-around run by junior wide receiver Cam Warren, and a 37-yard keeper by redshirt freshman quarterback Adam Brzeczeczek.

Nguyen had 11 carries for 107 yards and a touchdown, and it was his fourth 100-yard rushing effort of the season. Canada had 16 rushes for 83 yards and a score, and he was followed by Counts (6-for-58) and Kirschner (13 for 54).

Nguyen now has 1,770 career rushing yards, which moved him up to ninth all-time. He jumped from 12th to ninth, as he passed former running backs Dick Imer (1,692 yards, 1954-54), Jody Farmer (1,719 yards, 1986-89), and JR Waller (1,726 yards, 2002-05).

Smithwick-Hann was 14-of-21-2 for 205 yards and 3 touchdowns in his first career start. Counts, a true freshman from Mesa, Ariz., caught a team-high 4 passes for 36 yards and scored twice. Nine different Griz players had at least one reception and one rush in the game.

The Griz defense was led by end Tyrone Holmes, a true freshman, who had 9 tackles and 4 sacks. Sophomore cornerback Joshua Dennard added 7 tackles, while Tripp had 6 tackles, 2.5 stops for losses, and forced the fumble that led to his 80-yard TD on the fumble return. Tripp's fumble recovery was the seventh in his career, tying him with former safety Todd Ericson (7, 1990-93) for the third most in school history.

Yost was 36-of-56-1 for 323 yards and 3 TDs. ISU had two 100-yard receivers, as senior wide-out Rodrick Rumble had 12 catches for 102 yards and junior Cam Richmond grabbed 10 passes for 100 yards.

ISU freshman safety Taison Manu had a game-high 14 tackles, while sophomore linebacker Mitch Beckstead tallied 13.

BIG SKY CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

NAU ALONE ON TOP: Three teams entered last Saturday's schedule with perfect conference records and only Northern Arizona survived, winning on a late field goal. No. 1 Eastern Washington suffered a 30-27 upset at Southern Utah. No. 11 Cal Poly lost its first game of the season, falling at Sacramento State 35-29. NAU edged NC 12-10. The Lumberjacks' only touchdown came on a Mike Dosen 59-yard interception return. Andy Wilder kicked the game-winning field goal from 18 yards out with 15 seconds to play. NAU is 5-0 in conference for the first time since 1996. The Lumberjacks have won seven in a row for the first time since 1958. This is the fifth time in school history NAU has been 7-1 after eight games. NAU also accomplished the feat in 1923, 1956, 1957 and 1996. NAU was selected seventh by the coaches and ninth by the media in the preseason polls. NAU's remaining conference games are on the road against Idaho State, and at home against Southern Utah and Cal Poly. NAU's seven-game winning streak is the second-longest active streak in the FCS behind Lehigh's eight.

LEAGUE CLARIFIES TIEBREAKER: When the Big Sky expanded to 13 football members, a need for a new tiebreaker arose and was developed by the league. First and foremost, the tiebreaker is in place solely to determine which team will receive the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Championship. If teams tie for the conference title, they will be co-champions. The first tiebreaker is head-to-head. This includes match-ups of conference teams playing each other in non-conference games. So far, there have been two match-ups of conference teams playing in non-conference games. A third will take place on Nov. 3, when Cal Poly travels to EWU.

BOBCATS ROLL AFTER BYE: Montana State, which had a bye last week, returned to the field with an impressive 55-10 home win over North Dakota. Running back Cody Kirk returned after missing two games with an injury to rush for 160 yards and three touchdowns. MSU set school records with 695 yards of total offense and 49 first downs. MSU rushed for 436 yards, the third-most in single game in school history. Quarterback DeNarius McGhee threw three TD passes, raising his school-record career total to 64. McGhee has thrown a TD pass in 33 straight games. MSU's defense held ND to nine first downs and 180 yards of total offense, nine first downs, and tallied eight sacks.

HORNETS IN THE HUNT: Sacramento State played with heavy hearts on Saturday, days after the death of teammate John Bloomfield. The Hornets rode the wave of emotions to a 35-29 upset of Cal Poly. Sacramento State, Holy Cross of the Patriot League honored Bloomfield and Sacramento State on Saturday, wearing John Bloomfield's No. 43 on their helmets. In 1969, 43 years ago, Sacramento State dedicated its season to Holy Cross, after its season was cut short due to a hepatitis A outbreak. That season the Hornets finished 8-2 and were 5-1 in the Far Western Conference. For the final game of the year, Sacramento State donned Holy Cross jerseys and invited co-captains Tom Lamb and Bill Mocevicz to attend the contest against Puget Sound. Following a Hornet victory, Moncevicz had a game ball signed by each member of the team with an inscription that read: Holy Cross 49, Puget Sound 24. Sac State has positioned itself for a run at its first ever FCS playoff bid. The Hornets are 5-1 in their last six games at home against ranked opponents, with the only blemish was a 64-61 overtime loss to MSU in 2010. From 2001-2009, Sacramento State did not finish with a winning record.

SKY IN THE SAGARIN: The Big Sky jumped from fourth to second amongst FCS conference in this week's Sagarin Ratings. The Big Sky is behind the Missouri Valley. Four Big Sky teams are in the top 12 of FCS teams. Montana State is fifth amongst FCS teams and 86th overall. Cal Poly is 88th overall and sixth amongst FCS teams. EWU is seventh, and NAU is 12th.

MISSOULA, MONTANA— Montana sophomore quarterback Jordan Johnson tied a school record with six touchdown passes and senior wider receiver Jabin Sambrano tied a school mark with four scoring grabs, as the 11th-ranked Grizzlies rolled to a key Big Sky Conference victory.

The convincing win improved the Grizzlies record to 7-2 overall and 6-1 in Big Sky play, while the Wildcats are now 3-5/3-2. The Washington-Grizzly crowd of 25,401 was the 16th largest in 189 games played there.

It was an excellent all-around offensive and defensive effort by the Grizzlies, who have had to come from behind in a pair of recent wins over Northern Arizona (28-24) and Portland State (30-24). Montana has now won five games in a row.

Montana rolled to 545 yards of total offense and 29 first downs, and held Weber State to 290 yards and 19 first downs (six of them coming on the Wildcats' last drive).

The Wildcats had an impressive opening drive and went 73 yards on 11 plays en route to a 34-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Shaun McClain, taking a 3-0 lead with 9:13 to go in the first quarter.

The Griz went three-and-out on their first series, but then scored on their next two possessions, and took a 14-3 first-quarter lead when true freshman Josh Dennard scored his first career touchdown on an 18-yard pass from Johnson. Dennard's scoring grab was set up on three consecutive completions to Sambrano covering 33 yards and moved the ball to the WSU 18-yard line.

Montana took a 7-3 lead with 7:34 left in the opening period on a 31-yard screen pass from Johnson to junior halfback Peter Nguyen, and the Griz led the rest of the way.

The Grizzlies dominated the second quarter, out-gaining the Wildcats 252 to 35 in total yards, and jumped to a 38-3 halftime lead. UM had 13 more first downs (15 to 2) than WSU in the second quarter.

It was the Johnson to Sambrano combination that put the game away early for the Grizzlies, as they hooked up for three straight touchdowns, covering 11, 17, and 8 yards, the third one giving them a commanding 35-3 lead with 3:36 to go until intermission.

Montana's final score in the first half was a 41-yard field goal by senior kicker Brody McKnight. That was McKnight's 49th career field goal, moving him to third all-time, and breaking a tie with Kirk Duce (48, 1989-91).

Montana went to its running game in the second half and picked up 196 yards on 22 carries, and was 6-of-8 passing for 60 yards in the final 30 minutes. The Grizzlies tacked on one more score with the fourth Johnson-to-Sambrano touchdown pass, this one good from 25 yards out, giving UM a 45-3 advantage with 11:28 left in the third quarter.

WSU scored its only touchdown of the game with 42 seconds remaining on a 3-yard run by junior halfback C.J. Tuckett.

Johnson completed 23-of-32-0 passes for a career-high 299 yards en route to his record-tying six touchdown passes. He tied Brian Ah Yat (6 TD passes at Stephen F. Austin, 1998) and Dave Dickenson's (6 TDs throws versus Boise State, 1995) with his six scoring throws. He also rushed eight times for 53 yards to finish with 352 yards of total offense.

Sambrano's four scoring grabs tied him with four other players: Marc Mariani versus Southern Utah, 2008; Joe Douglass at Eastern Washington in 1996; Marvin Turk at Idaho in 1991; and Mike Rice against Idaho State in 1986.

Nguyen had career and game-highs of 15 carries for 85 yards. Sambrano finished with 7 receptions for 94 yards and the four TDs, while junior tight end Greg Hardy had 5 grabs for 36 yards.

Senior linebacker Caleb McSurdy led the defense with 10 tackles. Senior cornerback Houston Roots had 5 tackles, an interception, a tackle for a loss, and a pass break-up.

WSU was without injured starting quarterback Mike Hoke. His replacement, sophomore Jordan Adamczyk was 18-of-40-2 for 196 yards and was sacked just once, but was forced out of the pocket throughout the game.
